Douglas Wayne Swan passed away suddenly on Sunday, February 2, 2025. He was 63 years old.

Doug was born on November 13, 1961, in Pasadena, TX, and was the youngest of three children. Doug is preceded in death by his mother, Winfrey Harrison, his father Selwyn Lewis Swan, his eldest brother, Charles, his sister-in-law, Mary, and his nephew, Scott.

He is survived by his older brother, Thomas, his sister-in-law, Meg, and his nephews Charles, David (wife, Cortney), and David Michael.

As a young boy, Doug interned at the Houston Astrodome as a ball boy. He would later advance to work on the famous scoreboard climbing ladders high into the rafters late at night fixing issues and making it perfect for the next game. Eventually Doug would spend the majority of his career working for the Houston Rockets organization as the Director of Scoreboard Operations. An avid sport enthusiast, Doug deeply loved his Rocket's family and was deeply loved in return.

He was a treasured colleague who was described as "a source of upbeat, positive energy", "a good soul", "was 100% totally authentic to his core", "had an incredible sense of humor", and was "a great mentor and an even better friend".

And though he was loved and admired by his colleagues, he was absolutely adored by his two great-nephews, Caden and Jason, from whom he could invoke a joy and laughter that will never be matched.

Doug recently began his retirement and was on a 21 day voyage to Antarctica. On the 20th day - somewhere in the South Atlantic Ocean - he abruptly left this world, which is both heartbreaking and a testament to the fullness with which he lived. Doug's life was one steeped in rich adventure, defined by countless friendships, and marked by selfless generosity.

Doug was an amazing son, brother, uncle, great-uncle, and friend. His love, kindness, and wonderful spirit made him one of everyone's favorite people. He had a shrewd sense of humor and a sly grin. Through that mischievous smile we all knew his playful loving spirit. Most of all, he was known for being someone who lifted people up, was faithfully reliable, and always saw the best in others.

We are all better to have known him.

He will be deeply missed.
